



# How to set up BLEEDS FOR PRINTING

Want color to the edge ? Add bleed! When designing your document, go to **File > View Settings** and make sure both **Show Margins** and **Show Print Bleed** are checked. Make sure your background goes all the way to the edge of the extended bleed area shown.

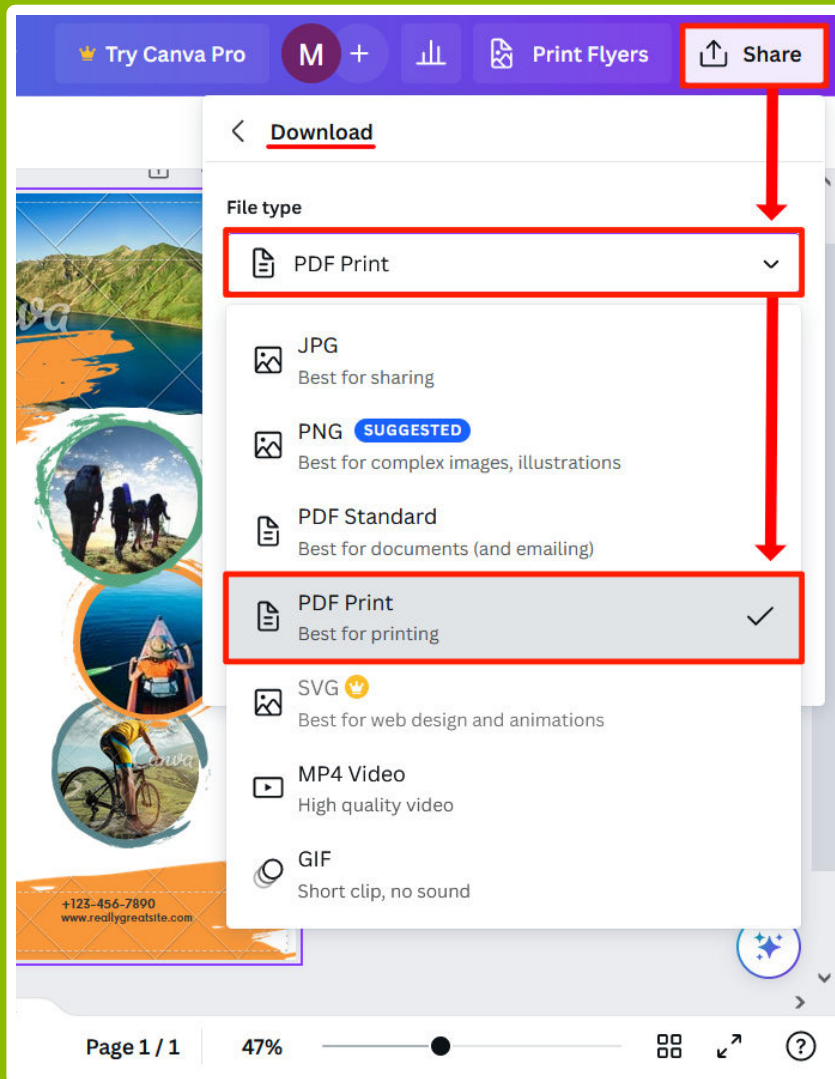

When exporting your document, go to **Share** > **Download** and make sure to select the **PDF Print** option from the dropdown menu.

Make sure **Crop marks and bleed** are checked in the PDF Print options. The **CMYK** color profile is preferred, but **RGB** is acceptable if you don't have Pro.
